The C&NW ordered 2 sleepers with an extra 3 side doors to handle stretcher patients from Chicago to the Mayo Clinic. One still exists in Green Bay and is being restored. Pullman also modified a sleeper-observation car to carry polio patients in iron lungs which was used from 1937-54
